Tom Ridge Environmental Center •



Headquarters for the PA Department of Conservation of Natural Resources (DCNR), Tom Ridge Environmental Center (TREC) is a great place for visitors to stop and learn about our natural landscape, native species, birdwatch, or enjoy the natural playground. Take the steps or an elevator to the top of the tower for a bird's eye view of the lake and neighboring Waldameer. Take a class or sign up for a guided hike, then be sure to stop in the gift shop (Presque Isle Gallery and Gifts) for some locally made art and gifts. 301 Peninsula Dr.

The Maritime Museum and U.S. Brig *Niagara*

Get to know a little bit more about the history of Lake Erie, including but not limited to the Battle of Lake Erie in which Oliver Hazard Perry's flagship, the Brig *Niagara*

sailed. Tours of the tall ship are included with the price of museum admission.

Standing at the end of Dobbin's Landing since 1995, the tower is an iconic point of reference for any Erieite. 
Boating Adventures

Whether it's for a romantic getaway around the bay, for educational purposes, or just for some family fun, Erie is not lacking in options for getting out on the water. Enjoy a dinner cruise at sunset onboard the Victorian Princess, or an education in maritime history on the tall ships Brig Niagara or Lettie G. Howard, learn about the natural landscape of Presque Isle aboard the Lady Kate or through its recurring Lagoon by Pontoon sessions, or get soaked and silly on the pirate-themed adventure boat, The Scallywaq.

Erie's Lighthouses

If you're visiting Presque Isle, you're likely aware of the Presque Isle Light Station that is open for tours all summer long, but Erie has two other lesser known but just as impressive lighthouses: the Erie Land Lighthouse (which was the first lighthouse lit on the Great Lakes) and the North Pier Light. Stop by all three for some photos and a great historic experience.






Erie's Historic Sites



Erie has a rich history, most of which involves our location on the lake – from the Battle of Lake Erie during the War of 1812 to our advantageous positioning near Canada in facilitation of the Underground Railroad and everything in between. We've got lighthouses, Nationally Registered Historic buildings and districts, museums (art, history, maritime, natural history), monuments, cemeteries, and plenty of adaptively reused vintage buildings that lend Erie its unmistakable character. For the history buff (seasoned or budding), you'll find lots to pique your interest.

Lighthouses

Being situated on a body of water can only mean one thing: lighthouses! And Erie has three open for viewing throughout the warmer months. Check out all three in one go with a combination tour available for purchase at the Presque Isle Light Station.

Erie Land Lighthouse

Erie's lesser known lighthouse was actually the first lighthouse lit on all of the Great Lakes in 1818. With tours to the top with a view unlike any other in Erie (with the North Pier lighthouse and Perry Monument in view), as well as a playground nearby, it's a nice place to spend a summer afternoon. // 2 Lighthouse St.



North Pier Light

Not quite a light "house," per say, the North Pier light sits at the channel between the lake and the bay, guiding vessels safely into harbor. Its iconic black and white stripes are great for photo ops, and nearby Beach 11 boasts a natural playground and some peaceful beaches. Near Beach 11, Presque Isle State Park

Presque Isle Light Station

Still an active guide to navigation as well as a historic site in Erie, the Presque Isle Light Station is a must-stop for all history lovers (or just those who appreciate a great view of the lake). The recently restored attached keepers house now reflects its history. Tower climbs are available every 20 minutes and a nearby gift shop takes care of all your souvenir shopping.

Museums

Hagen History Center

The Hagen History Center campus contains multitudes in terms of local history: a restored Gilded Age Richardsonian Romanesque masterpiece of a manse, expansive archives for research, a new wing that includes "The Story of Us" exhibit which examines local Erie history through our people and manufacturing, the restored Wood-Morrison House which holds Erie military artifacts, as well as the complete reconstruction of Frank Lloyd Wright's office open for touring.

Erie Maritime Museum

Our Maritime Museum, located on the bay adjacent to the Blasco Memorial Library, is also the home port of the U.S. Brig *Niagara*, a replica of the vessel Oliver Hazard Perry sailed into the Battle of Lake Erie during the War of 1812. Learn about this battle as well as Erie's rich maritime history during your visit.

The Erie Art Museum

The original portion of the Erie Art Museum that faces State Street and was originally

the 1839 Customs House is undergoing a massive restoration beginning this year. Enjoy the historic charm of this portion of the building while exploring the 80,000 square feet of the museum, which houses their impressive permanent collection and temporary exhibits. // 20 E. 5th St.

The om Ridge Environmental Center 🔷

Situated at the entrance to Presque Isle State Park, The Tom Ridge Environmental Center (TREC) features specimens, artwork, films, interactive displays, and a fluctuating seasonal exhibits, while housing employees of the PA Department of Conservation of Natural Resources, the Regional Science Consortium, and Presque Isle Gallery and Gifts (stop in for that perfect souvenir). // 301 Peninsula Dr.

Firefighters Historical Museum

Tucked away in a West Bayfront neighborhood, the Firefighters Historical Museum is housed in a former historic fire station and features a large collection of artifacts involving Erie's firefighting heritage.

Lake Shore Railway Historical Society

If rail history is your thing, you have to stop by the Lake Short Railway museum. Established in 1956, the railroad museum was built on the grounds of the former New York Central Railroad passenger depot and includes historic locomotives, artifacts, and equipment.

Many of the smaller municipalities in Erie County have their own regional historical societies that are within historic buildings, contain township archives, memorials, and artifacts of local significance. The volunteers for these establishments often advocate for local historic buildings and aid in their restoration.

Other Historic Sites

The Erie Cemetery

This historic cemetery that spans 75 acres in the heart of the city was incorporated in 1851 and contains the graves of most of Erie's early residents, many of whom were significant to our local (and national) history like General Strong Vincent, Daniel Dobbins, and Sarah A. Reed. // 2116 Chestnut St.

Perry Monument

The lighthouses aren't the only historic structures on Presque Isle. Perry Monument, an obelisk overlooking Lake Erie, was erected in 1926 on the shores of Misery Bay to commemorate Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry in his victory in the Battle of Lake Erie in 1812.

Covered Bridges

Erie County has two remaining historic covered bridges: the recently restored and reopened Waterford Covered Bridge (699 Niemeyer Rd., Waterford) and the Harrington Covered Bridge (Barney Road in Albion). Nearby Ashtabula County, Ohio boasts an incredible 19 remaining covered bridges. Take a short drive west and go back in time!





Art Galleries and Creative Spaces



Erie's art scene is diverse, inspiring, and always beautiful. Whether you're patronizing some of the many unique spots listed to appreciate and support local art, take a class to learn a new skill, or purchase a piece as a memento, Erie boasts plenty of art galleries, spaces, studios, and museums. Long established museums and retail galleries exist alongside newer collectives and media art facilities to paint a colorful swath of creative energy in Erie.

Celebrating their 50th year of existence, Glass Growers Gallery has staying power and for good reason. 





With dozens of local wineries to choose from, you can make a day of it, hop on a bus tour, and try out a number of spots in one go; or pick one, grab a cheese plate, and settle in for a sunset over the vineyards.

Planning Your Presque Isle Getaway 2025

here's a reason Presque Isle State Park is the most visited park in Pennsylvania. It offers a complete range of attractions: beaches, forested trails, diverse recreational opportunities, and stunning natural beauty. Millions visit the park each year, but even on the most crowded beach weekend, quiet corners can be found and explored.

This recurved sandspit has six discrete ecological zones – the shoreline, sand plains and new ponds, dunes and ridges, old ponds and marshes, thickets and sub-climax forests, and climax forests. Because of the diverse habitats, Presque Isle is home to more than 100 rare species of plants and animals, more than any



other area of comparable size in Pennsylvania.

Birding enthusiasts come from all over the world to this Important Bird Area (IBA) as designated by the Audubon Society. More than 340 species of birds have been recorded at the park, including state and federally endangered birds like the piping plover, which have again started nesting at **Gull Point**.

Rightly known as a beach destination, Presque Isle's lakeside boasts seven miles of sandy shoreline. Visit **Beach 6** for a game of beach volleyball, pack a picnic for **Beach 7**, or stop by the western end of **Beach 10 (aka Sunset Point)** to see kites swirl in the sky. Swimming is permitted only at the eight guarded beaches from Memorial Day to Labor Day. But come back in winter to see the impressive ice dunes that protect the shoreline from winter storms.

The waters of Presque Isle Bay and the lake offer abundant opportunities to play. Registered motorboats and jet skis are both permitted, although no internal combustion engines are allowed in the interior lagoons. However, you're welcome to rent a canoe or kayak from the **Presque Isle Canoe and Boat Livery** or enjoy any of several daily free pontoon boat tours. Depending on wind conditions, the waters may be ideal for sailboarding, skimboarding, paddleboarding, and even surfing.

As the "Fishing Capital of Pennsylvania," Lake Erie and Presque Isle Bay offer numerous opportunities to wet a lure. Bank fishing is available in many parts of the park and four boat launches serve various sizes of watercraft. Fuel, bait, and food are available at the Marina. Anglers can also try their luck on the frozen bay in winter, too.

The 13.5-mile **Karl Boyes Multi-purpose National Recreation Trail** winds all the way around the park and is utilized by walkers, joggers, cyclists, surreys, and inline skaters. Bike and surrey rentals are available at the concession in the **Waterworks** area.

In the interior are 11 miles of hiking trails. Watch beavers tend

their lodges or find deer, mink, and eight species of turtles. Be prepared for ticks by wearing long pants with your socks tucked and keep the bug repellent handy. For adventurous souls, a walk out to the natural area of Gull Point is a must. Views from the observation platform include newly forming sand plains and the eastern end of Erie's cityscape and bay. In winter, these trails become cross-country skiing or snowshoeing pathways or just a tranquil walkway through a sleeping forest.

History buffs can learn more about Erie's part in the War of 1812 at the **Perry Monument**, where Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry's fleet overwintered in 1812-1814. Be sure to discover why the adjacent water to **Misery Bay** is called **Graveyard Pond**. Near the monument you can also catch a ride on the 65-foot Great Lakes vessel *Lady Kate*, which offers a 14-mile, 90-minute narrated tour that ventures out onto the open waters of Lake Erie.

The **Presque Isle Light Station**, which went into service in 1873 and is still an active guide to navigation, offers tours that explain the long history of the house and keepers (May-September), as well as a gift shop. The **North Pier Light** is accessible from Beach 11 on Coast Guard Rd. While not a lighthouse in the traditional sense, the 1858 navigational guide, with its black and white stripes, makes for great photo opportunities. A smaller beacon, the **Erie Land Lighthouse**, which was the first lighthouse lit on the Great Lakes, is open for tours on the mainland (off of Presque Isle) on the north channel (2 Lighthouse St.)

Presque Isle recently celebrated its 100th Anniversary, having been set aside as a state park in 1921. Come see this enduring treasure.

Local Bird Watching Spots



Erie has some gorgeously scenic spots for scoping, searching, photographing, and learning about our native and migratory feathered friends. Our natural waterways and the ecosystems that surround it make for very diverse birding experiences, from shorebirds to forest-dwellers and everything in between.

Presque Isle State Park *

The crown jewel of birding in Erie is Presque Isle State Park, a 3,200-acre recurved sandspit jutting out into Lake Erie and forming Erie Bay on which the City of Erie sits. With seven types of habitats, the park welcomes a wide variety of avian life at all times of the year.

Within Presque Isle, great spots for bird watching include:

Fry's Landing, Pine Tree Trail, and Dead Pond Trail (especially the area around Thompson Circle). Graveyard Pond and Long Pond trails have access to the lagoon system for waders in the spring, summer, and fall and waterfowl in fall, winter, and spring. Gull Point, a designated natural area, is partially closed April 1 through Oct. 31 but there is a roped trail leading to two observation decks for spotting migrating and nesting shorebirds. In winter, snowy owls may also be found at Gull Point and sometimes on the beaches and breakwaters of the park.

Pymatuning State Park

Pymatuning has the largest concentration of bald eagles in

Pennsylvania, along with great opportunities to see waterfowl, especially in the spring and fall. Nearby are PA Game Commission Wildlife Management Areas off of Hartstown Rd. that offer habitat for a wide variety of migratory and nesting shorebirds, waterfowl, and forest birds. Entrance to the Management Areas is restricted but roadside spots and parking lots are open for safe viewing. // 2660 Williamsfield Rd., Jamestown

Part of Pennsylvania's Department of Conservation of Natural Resources and a perfect spot for woodland warblers, sparrows, and bank swallows.



Presque Isle State Park 🔷

While most know Presque Isle for its gorgeous sandy beaches, our state park offers much more than a day of lounging in the sun or swimming. With approximately 11 miles of hiking trails, not including a 13.5-mile multi-use path, the microclimates and varied ecosystems within the park offer plenty of options for a vigorous hike. 301 Peninsula Dr.

Wintergreen Gorge Trails

The wilds of Wintergreen Gorge, near Penn State Behrend, are always a fun adventure. With views of the incredible, eponymous gorge, swimming holes, creeks, and plenty of local flora and fauna, the whole family will be one with nature. // 3399 Cooper Rd.

Edinboro Lake

Edinboro Lake is a 250-acre glacial kettle lake that is a popular summer spot for locals and tourists. On the west side of the lake, there is Pat Crawford Beach and the uniquely

designed Billings Park Playground. On the eastern side of the lake is Edinboro Lake Resort where you can snag some grub at the Sunset Grill overlooking the water, hear some live music, and rent kayaks, canoes, or pontoon boats. 12670 Edinboro Rd., Edinboro

Erie Bluffs State Park

This state park, officially established in 2004, is located just past Lake City and only 12 miles west of Erie. The nearly 600-acre park has a full mile of undeveloped shoreline that includes vertigo-inducing bluffs nearly 100 feet high overlooking Lake Erie. You can explore the old growth forest, dip your toes into Elk Creek, and look for some of the dozens of species of birds, mammals, plants, reptiles, amphibians, and fungi while on your journey. // 11100 W Lake Rd.



Headwaters Park

This 72-acre park is located off Route 8 on Wager Road, nestled, of all places, between an industrial park and Interstate 90. Made up of streams, wetlands, woods, and meadows, it's a little taste of reclaimed forest paradise only a few minutes from the city. The park gets its name for containing the headwaters of Mill Creek.

Howard Eaton Reservoir

Just shy of the New York line, nestled between Ashton and Findley Lake roads is the Howard Eaton Reservoir, sometimes referred to as Bull Dam. This nearly 250-acre reservoir was built in 1941 on a tributary to French Creek to provide water for North East residents.

Today, it has an easy and relaxing 3.2-mile trail around it called Bull Dam Loop along with numerous other wooded trails to the north and south of the reservoir.

Lake Pleasant

The 61-acre glacier-made, groundwater-fed Lake Pleasant is located in Venango Township just past the Greene Township line. There's a boat launch for non-motorized boats, great spots for fishing, or you can merely find a spot to sit down, relax your brain, and take in the flora, fauna, and fresh air.

Picnicana Park

In 1966, Summit Township purchased Picnicana Park from

the Klaus family, who had first established it as a picnic area in 1951. Today, it still offers up 34 acres of woods to explore with 1.5 miles of trails added in 2014. The park also includes a great playground, as well as a softball field and basketball, volleyball, pickleball, and horseshoe courts.

Shades Beach

If you're looking to walk some serene beaches on Lake Erie, but want somewhere different than Presque Isle, give Shades Beach off of East Lake Road a visit. There is, of course, the beach where you can walk and search for the lake's famous beach glass, but there are also wooded trails on the bluffs overlooking the glistening lake, as well as a boat launch, rental pavilions, and a well-maintained playground.

Six Mile Creek Park

Past Harborcreek but before North East off of Clark Road is the 425-acre Six Mile Creek Park, gifted to Harborcreek Township by the county in 2011. It has a short and sweet 0.7-mile loop, a handicap accessible trail, the peaceful Six Mile Creek, and plenty of scenic views that would look great on your Instagram.

Union City Dam

While Crawford County has the popular Woodcock Dam, Erie County has its own dam located between Union City and Waterford, a short distance off Route 97 on Middleton Road. The dam's gate is open from 7 a.m. to dusk all year to soak in the tranquil views, take a hike, bird watch, or fish. Picnic tables, grills, and restrooms are also available.






